 - a) Resident brought up need for traffic study on Pratt St, east of Conkling due to speeding and accidents. HCa supports need for study and will combine it with other comprehensive efforts in the neighborhood. There was discussion as to possible solutions, all of which have pros and cons (speed bumps, one-way streets, bump-outs, etc.)

 - ii) Plans for a follow-up event with Clementine
 - iii) Funds were approved for up to \$2500 to purchase signs, sheds, and other needed items

 - ii) Police concerns
 - (1) Currently under 190 officers for Southeast
 - (2) 4 10 hour shifts will not change until union contract is changed
 - (3) Commisionaer Davis is being confirmed at Batts' replacement (this was objected to by a resident, who asked about Davis' involvement in kidnapping conspiracy in past, Kraft will look into it, but expressed support of Davis.)
 - iii) Need for funding for OrchKids program at Highlandtown #215, 25-30k defecit for program

- iv) Traffic concerns
 - (1) There is a need for a comprehensive study to address traffic issues
 - (2) We need to get fewer cars on the road and increase density
- b) Councilman Brandon Scott (2nd District)
 - i) If there are any questions, contact Rachel Timmins: Community Aide
 - ii) Introduced legislation to give tax credits to residents who maintain vacants next to them in response to 311 calls. This will need to be taken to Annapolis for approval first
 - iii) Also pushing for municipal ID card program for young people to track data for Rrec centers, library, MTA, Youthworks and other common city services. Other cities have instituted this program with success.
 - iv) Grading system for health inspection for restaurants passed, now restaurants have to have sings posted explaining why they are closed due to violations
 - v) Meeting is to be held on Sept 28th about sex workers/trafficking along Conkling St. Will be held at City Hall
 - vi) Senior Center has been renovated at Highlandtown #237 and will be occupied this year.
